UPDATES ON HOUSING PLANS

GRAB LANE

In 2021 Story Homes submitted a planning application to build 167 homes off both sides of Grab Lane. That application was withdrawn in May this year.

Cllr Alistair Sinclair said:

"We understand that Story Homes intend to submit an alternative plan, and we Green Councillors want to make sure residents' concerns are listened to and taken on board.

"Development is something that existing residents ought to feel included in, not something they feel is 'done to them'."

WYRESDALE ROAD

The Eccleston Homes application for 27 homes on the south side of Wyresdale Road has been amended to incorporate a new, extensive surface water management scheme. It is designed to make the flow of water into Burrow Beck slower than it is currently from the undeveloped land.

CYCLE LINK TO LEISURE PARK?

Green Councillors are aware and supportive of residents who would like to see a new pedestrian and cycle route linking the new housing at Lancaster Leisure Park to Coulston Road.

Cllr Alistair Sinclair said:

"A new route could bring a lot of benefits to residents of Bowerham and businesses at the Leisure Park.

"But first there needs to be some feasibility work on different route options, taking account of the hilliness of that area.

"Funding also needs to be identified. Sadly there has not been any progress on this yet, but we will keep pushing for it."

ADVICE FOR RENTERS

Green Cllr Faye Penny said:

"Many students and other renters will be protected from the recent energy price rises if housing

contracts were signed many months ago with energy bills included in the rent.

"However, it is essential to check the small print of your contract in case you are liable for energy costs that exceed a particular amount.

"If you have any concerns, try to arrange a meeting with your landlord to discuss who is liable for extra costs, and to understand likely energy consumption based on previous years.

"Ask your landlord to upgrade the property if it has an old, inefficient heating system, poor insulation, or no thermostats that you can control on radiators or the boiler. You may also be able to reduce your electricity and gas usage in other ways."
