SOUTH LANCASTER PLANS SCRAPPED

County Council cancels plans for roads and new town

Funding for building new roads as part of the South Lancaster project has been returned to Government by the Conservative-led County Council in the face of escalating construction costs. This puts an end to the controversial plan to build over 9,000 new houses on the countryside between Lancaster and Galgate.

Green County Cllr Gina Dowding said: *“This is great news. The South Lancaster project was a huge financial risk to both the City and County Councils, because it relied on unrealistically large contributions of cash from developers. But just as importantly, it would have had a terrible impact on the local environment and efforts to combat climate change.*

“The project had been pushed through at the City Council level in 2021 by Labour and some Conservatives and Independent councillors, despite well-founded arguments from Green councillors, who did not vote for it.”

Independent councillors across the country vote for Caroline

The Local Government Association's (LGA) Independent Group has elected Cllr Caroline Jackson to be its Deputy Leader.

513 councillors from across the country voted for Caroline. The majority of the group's members are independent councillors but also includes Greens. The LGA is funded by national government and seeks to represent its members to national bodies, and to ensure the smooth running of local government.

Cllr Caroline said: "I'm delighted so many councillors from around the country have put their trust in my experience of working with councillors from different political backgrounds."

GREENS TAKING ACTION TO GET POSTBOX REPLACED

Greens in negotiations with Royal Mail and Co-op to get postbox reinstated

Green Cllrs Jack Lenox, Sam Riches and Caroline Jackson have been in communication with Royal Mail and the Co-op to get a replacement postbox installed at the shop on Quernmore Road. The estates surrounding the Co-op were served by a postbox on Quernmore Road until it was vandalised late last year.

Royal Mail has said they'll consider installing a new postbox if the Co-op requests one. Cllr Jack Lenox has asked the Co-op to make this request, and has proposed establishing a community postbox until this happens.

Cllr Jack said: "This part of the city is already poorly served for basic facilities. The next nearest postbox is almost a mile away on Windermere Road.

I want to set up a temporary, community-run postbox at the Co-op until a proper one is installed. Please get in touch with me if you'd like to help with this."

HOW TO MEET LOCAL HOUSING NEEDS

Green general election candidate, Cllr Jack Lenox, calls for immediate review of Local Plan

Following the cancellation of the planned South Lancaster road and new town, Cllr Jack Lenox said: "We need to review where well-designed housing can be built, without massive new road schemes or unacceptable impacts. The local and national shortage of affordable housing is caused by a reliance on private housing developers who prioritise making bigger profits over meeting local needs.

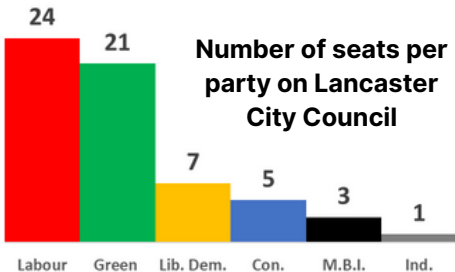
"Driven by the Greens, around 200 affordable homes are now planned for parts of the Lancaster centre's Canal Quarter site; and over 130 on the former Skerton School site. The Council is also identifying smaller infill sites which could be suitable for building new homes."

GREENS, LABOUR & LIB DEMS RUN CITY COUNCIL

Greens win 21 (out of 61) Council seats

In May's City Council elections, the Green Party won 21 out of 61 seats (up from 10 in 2019).

No party won a majority of seats, so Labour, Greens and Lib Dems have agreed to form a shared administration. It is led by a Labour councillor, with Green Cllr Caroline Jackson as Deputy Leader.

Greens have 4 of the 10 cabinet places, including the 'Climate Action', 'Finance', 'Regeneration, Skills & Digital Innovation' and Housing & Homelessness' portfolios. The Green group is more diverse than ever, with a majority of women, and 3 new councillors under the age of 24.

STREET WEEDS UPDATE

Lancashire County Council has contracted Morecambe Town Council (MTC) to tackle street weeds across the district. Green County Cllr for Lancaster Central, Gina Dowding, said: *"It is good to see their staff using electric quad bikes to get around, and responding more quickly to bad spots. However, it is disappointing that glyphosate herbicide is still being used, despite increasing environmental concerns.
