### RENEWABLE ENERGY IN HALTON-WITH-AUGHTON

#### Cllr Kevin speaks about the Parish on the BBC

Kevin appeared on the 'Rural Power' episode of BBC's Countryfile to talk about renewable energy in Haltonwith-Aughton.

Halton has a long history of innovative, community led, sustainable energy projects, starting in 2009 when solar and thermal panels were installed at the Centre,

along with a ground source heat pump. Since then there have been more solar panels installed on Wenning House, construction of the Halton Lune Hydro, and creation of Forgebank Cohousing. Green Councillors have been at the forefront of these projects and will continue to lead similarly sustainable projects.

### GREENS CALL FOR WATER TO BE PUT BACK IN PUBLIC HANDS

Privatised water: a 'scandal that needs to end'

Thousands of local residents had their water cut off just before Christmas, after icy weather damaged the water supply network. Morecambe & Lunesdale's Green Parliamentary Candidate, Cllr Gina Dowding, said:

"Huge thanks to staff from the City Council and United Utilities who worked hard to support everyone during the loss of supply.

"While this was caused mainly by the cold weather, it was not helped by chronic under-investment in the water supply network since privatisation in 1989. It's a scandal that needs to end."

#### **Eye-watering figures:**

- 3 billion litres of water are wasted every day in England and Wales, due to leaks.
- The annual pay package for the boss of United Utilities is reported to be £3.2 million.
- Privatised water companies paid £57 billion in dividends to share-holders over 30 years.

### **CITY COUNCIL BUDGET PRESSURES**

#### High inflation forces difficult decisions

Lancaster City Council is facing very significant financial pressure, mainly because Government funding has not increased in line with big hikes in energy, fuel and wage costs. The funding increase from Government for the next year amounts to less than 1.5% of the budget, whereas general inflation is more than 10%. Green cabinet member Cllr Tim Hamilton-Cox said:

"Cabinet members are working together to identify savings which have the 'least worst' impact on services. The Council cannot rely on increasing income to fill the gap.

"Some services will inevitably have to be reduced, but we are prioritising maintaining things like street cleaning, parks and green spaces, support for the poorest and most vulnerable people, and delivery of new - especially affordable - housing.

"Greens have successfully pushed the Council to invest in energy-saving and generating its own renewable energy. Without this, the Council's budget gap would be much worse."

# **AMAZON EXHIBITION AT HALTON MILL**

#### Cllr Kevin contributes to exhibition about rainforest defenders

'For Dom, Bruno & the Amazon' is an exhibition that honours Dom Phillips and Bruno Pereira and others who have lost their lives defending the rainforest. It will return to Halton in February at St. Wilfrid's School.

Dom and Bruno were murdered in June while they were in the Brazilian Amazon researching sustainable solutions for a book Dom was writing. Dom's sister, Siân Phillips, ran a choir at Halton Mill for many years and has performed there with her band.

Kevin met Dom in 2021 when he visited

Halton, and Dom participated in a salmon and trout monitoring session at Halton Lune Hydro. Kevin researched one of the exhibition panels, 'Good Mines are hard to find', outlining how nearly all of the world's mines score badly on environmental, social and governance criteria.
