## **NEW PICNIC TABLES FOR STODDAY**

Two new picnic tables and new surfacing have been installed, with a plaque commemorating Queen Elizabeth II, at Stodday picnic area on the Lune Estuary path. Cllr Tim Dant said: "This is the result of collaboration between Aldcliffe with Stodday Parish Council (who led the project), Lancaster City Council (who did the works), and Lancashire County Council and Lancaster University's Wind Turbine Fund (who both part funded it). A couple of benches will be installed soon."

## **£2 BUS FARES TIL END OF MARCH**

Cllr Abi Mills, Vice Chair of the Lancaster District Bus User Group, said: "The Government is encouraging more people to use buses by capping single bus fares at £2 for everyone until the end of March this year. ## STUDENT HOUSING - TEST CASE WON BY COUNCIL

The owner of a Greaves terraced house has had his application to convert it to a student let refused by a planning inspector. In 2021, after years of lobbying by Green Councillors, the Council adopted a policy to restrict the number of student 'Houses in Multiple Occupancy' (HMO's) in a neighbourhood. New conversions will be refused if more than 10% of properties are already let to students. Cllr Abi said:

"In this case the owner appealed against the Council's decision but was unsuccessful. The aim of keeping family homes and a mixed community, has been upheld."

# **LOWER GREAVES PARKING UPDATE**

After a request from Green Cllrs, County Highways have said they will paint H-bars on the corners with dropped kerbs to prevent dangerous parking. Cllr Abi said:

"We welcome this action, but would like more to be done to make road crossing and pavements safe for pedestrians. We have invited the new County Cabinet member responsible for Highways to come and see the situation, and we have also requested that the traffic wardens come to this area more frequently."

## **ALDCLIFFE PATH DIVERSION**

Aldcliffe Hall Drive, leading from the canal to Aldcliffe, has been designated as a Public Right of Way since 2018. Now a diversion has been proposed by the owner of the renovated East Lodge. The new route would involve removing trees and shrubs.

Cllr Tim Dant said:

"It is good to see East Lodge at last being renovated. However, Aldcliffe with Stodday Parish Council and Green Councillors have objected to the trees being removed and to the diversion away from the direct route that has been used by Lancastrians for sixty years."

Privatised water: a 'scandal that needs to end'

Thousands of local residents had their water cut off just before Christmas, after icy weather damaged the water supply network. Lancaster's Green parliamentary candidate, Cllr Jack Lenox, said:

"Huge thanks to staff from the City Council and United Utilities who worked hard to support residents and businesses during the loss of supply.

"While this was caused mainly by the cold weather, it was not helped by chronic under-investment in the water supply network since privatisation in 1989. It's a scandal that needs to end."




#### **Eye-watering figures:**

- 3 billion litres of water are wasted every day in England and Wales, due to leaks.
- The annual pay package for the boss of United Utilities is reported to be £3.2 million.
- Privatised water companies paid £57 billion in dividends to share-holders over 30 years.

## **CITY COUNCIL BUDGET PRESSURES**

## High inflation forces difficult decisions

Lancaster City Council is facing very significant financial pressure, mainly because Government funding has not increased in line with big hikes in energy, fuel and wage costs. The funding increase from Government for the next year amounts to less than 1.5% of the budget, whereas general inflation is more than 10%. Green cabinet member Cllr Tim Hamilton-Cox said:



"Cabinet members are working together to identify savings which have the 'least worst' impact on services. The Council cannot rely on increasing income to fill the gap.

Some services will inevitably have to be reduced, but we are prioritising maintaining things like street cleaning, parks and green spaces, support for the poorest and most vulnerable people, and delivery of new - especially affordable - housing.

Greens have successfully pushed the Council to invest in energy-saving and generating its own renewable energy. Without this, the Council's budget gap would be much worse."
