Gina's our Eurostar!

Gina Dowding became the North West's first Green MEP in May, with 12.5% of the vote overall across the NW region, which stretches from Cheshire to Cumbria.

Gina began her work as an MEP in July alongside six other Green MEPs from the UK and 66 Green/Alliance MEPs from other European countries.

Gina said: *"Thank you to everyone who voted Green in this year's local and European elections. My top priority is to get urgent action by governments and industry to tackle climate change, restore our natural world, and end extreme poverty."*

"I will continue my City and County Councillor roles until the UK's future relationship with the EU is clear. At the time of writing, it's impossible to predict whether or when Brexit will happen or whether there will be a General Election or People's Vote by the time you receive this newsletter! Juggling three roles is challenging, but as an MEP, I have staff to help me both in Brussels and here in the NW region. Whatever happens next, the Green Party and I will continue to work hard for the Lancaster District."



Greens in co-operative cabinet

There are now 10 Green City Councillors in Lancaster, making it the third “greenest” council in England in terms of councillor numbers. No single political party has an overall majority, so the Greens are working with Labour and Lib Dems in a ‘cooperative alliance’. Greens have three (out of 10) places on the Council’s Cabinet, with the following portfolios:

- Cllr Tim Hamilton-Cox - Economic Development
- Cllr Caroline Jackson - Housing and Homelessness
- Cllr Dave Brookes - Environment and Public Realm.



They will be working with the seven Labour cabinet members to ensure that the City Council delivers on the promises it made when a climate emergency was declared earlier this year.

Uniform Project launched

Eden North project taking shape

The Eden Trust is preparing a planning application for an £85m “world-class tourist attraction that is completely in tune with its natural surroundings” in Morecambe. A large section of Marine Road could be pedestrianised to encourage visitors to use sustainable transport and increase footfall to local businesses. The buildings will be no taller than the adjacent Midland Hotel, and a 4,000-capacity outdoor arena is planned as part of the development.

More plastics to be recycled

County Cllr Gina Dowding set up and chaired a County task group on reducing single-use plastics. One of the outcomes of this initiative, supported by Lancaster City Council, has been to expand the range of materials that can be collected for recycling via kerbside boxes.

From 1 October you'll be able to put clean plastic tubs, trays and pots in your recycling box, in addition to plastic bottles. Gina said: “It's great to see both County and City Councils committing to increasing the range of plastics that can be recycled. Of course it is still better to avoid buying things packaged in plastic in the first place, wherever possible!”

Salt Ayre Leisure Centre’s green power boost

Green Cllr Tim Hamilton-Cox reports: “Since 2012, Salt Ayre has had a large array of solar panels on its roof. The Council is now planning for much more solar electricity generation. In early 2020, around 1MW capacity (that is up to 3,700 individual panels) will be installed on the ground to supply a large proportion of the Centre's electricity demand. There is also scope to expand solar power generation onto the adjacent Council-owned former landfill site, to meet some of the wider district's electricity needs, and to create new 'green collar' jobs in installation and maintenance.”
