# FLORA Path Funding Success

Following a £30,000 grant from the Lancashire Environment Fund, the Fairfield Association has now raised enough money to build a new path through the newer part of the reserve (FLORA). The path will link Aldcliffe Road with the footpath to the Millennium Orchard.

### Art at the Triangle

The first art exhibition is to take place at the Aldcliffe Road Triangle from Sat 2nd to Sun 3rd Sept (10-4). The exhibitors are Cromwell Road artists Gill Aitken and Phil Ferguson Jones. Much of the work is inspired by the canal and the FAUNA nature reserve—indeed, 20% of the sales go to the Fairfield Association.

## Electric Vehicle Charging Points

A Scotforth resident wants to create a network of electric vehicle charging points in Lancaster in order to help make electric vehicles a viable alternative to petrol and diesel.

The County Council is planning to install 6 charge points at on-street sites in Lancaster and the City Council hopes to install two in car parks during this financial year. But as more charging points are clearly needed, Dan Heery is setting up a co-operative to raise funds to install overnight charging points. ## Long Marsh Lane Flooding

Long Marsh Lane suffered surface water flooding after the deluge of rain in mid July. Residents say that this is because gullies have not been cleared. Similar issues have been reported on Abraham Heights. Councillors are pushing the County Council to take action.

## Fracking too Close for Comfort

County Cllr Gina Dowding took part in a peaceful protest at the Preston New Road fracking site in July and 'locked-on' to a barrier to demonstrate the strength of feeling of opposition to the shale gas industry setting up in Lancashire. After lying for 15 hours on the ground, Gina was arrested along with 12 other people Gina said:

*"I have never been arrested before but I am outraged that the Government is intent on turning Lancashire into a gas field despite the original planning application at New Road being turned down. What is happening a few miles down the road today will soon happen in north Lancashire too. Much of this area has been licensed for fracking and the industry will need to drill hundreds of gas wells to be financially viable."*

## Greens want 400 Local Jobs

In July, Green councillor Tim Hamilton-Cox led on a motion which sought to commit Lancaster City Council to source more of its goods and services from locally-based businesses. Preston City Council has been doing this since 2013. Even more importantly, Preston has encouraged 12 other public sector organisations to do the same. They claim that this has led to over £10m of procurement spend by the anchor institutions being re-directed to local businesses, equivalent to creating 400 jobs. Tim said

*“Despite the original motion being watered down by Labour councillors, an officer report on increasing local procurement should come before councillors by January 2018.”*

## County Leader in Trouble

Conservative councillors elected Geoff Driver as County Council leader, despite his arrest a few days before on suspicion of conspiracy to pervert the course of justice.

This relates to an investigation into financial irregularities in a contract that was set up when he previously led the County Council, before 2013.

### **Milking Stile Phone Box**

After complaints from residents, Cllr Jon Barry has asked BT to remove the phone box at the end of Milking Stile Lane. The phone hadn't worked for a long time and was filthy. BT has started a 90 day consultation for the removal of the kiosk with the City Council. Following this, the box could be removed in early 2018.

### **B & Q leaving**

The B&Q store on Aldcliffe Road looks set to be replaced by an Aldi shop in early 2019, after Aldi bought the freehold of the site. Cllr Dave Brookes said: *"I share residents' concern about the traffic impact of a food store—though it will be difficult to oppose in planning terms."*

### **Cars on Cycle Path**

The County Council's new plans are to put a lockable gate at the St George's Quay end of the cycle path to prevent cars accessing the path. They say that this will happen in the 2017/18 financial year (*I'm not counting my chickens*, ed).

### **Long Marsh Lane Bollards**

County Council officials think they have come up with a solution to rat-

running up Long Marsh Lane. They intend to introduce bollards near to the railway bridge plus a turning circle. This solution was the most popular in a consultation of residents carried out last Autumn by Green councillors.
